In their 80s and 90s, many struggle to grow potatoes for a food supply and chop wood for heating fuel. Poor and in failing health, all are in need of food, medication and heat. Over the years we have received thousands of letters of thanks for the aid and support you have provided.

One loaf of bread was 1 grivna and 30 kopecs, now it is 3 grivnas and 75 kopecs –it lasts me for three days...My dearest friends... I can't imagine how I would survive without your help." "I am 85 years old. I live alone. The heat is from a wood-burning stove. In the winter it needs firewood. ...I am touched by your attention." Celia G. - Lithuania

"Dear beloved friends, Every time I get your letters, I get healthier. You are my elixir of health. I am very pleased to have such dedicated, sensitive, responsive friends who help me live through all the misfortunes and hardships.

I do not know how I would survive if it were not for you.

Life in our country became very hard for the old and the sick there are no advantages or respect.... I received gelt from you in the amount of \$600, enormous thanks! ... I wish you happiness, health, long years.



I pray for you that you be and that all the beloved American friends be healthy and happy. Thank you very much for the financial assistance that is provided <u>only</u> by you. You are our saviors.
